This paper is to give a feminist reading of her short story The Story of an Hour, written on April 19, 1894, which is in the American literary canon today. To emphasise its significance, one should mention the publication of this short story in one of the early issues of the Vogue (Toth 172). In her stories, Chopin dared to write about women, finding their personal freedom and choosing their own ways of liberation very uncommon fiction in that period of time or as Papke claims, the first modern female literary discourse in America (4).
